## Centre to help engg colleges hire teachers

THE Union Ministry of Human Resources Development has offered to help private and state run engineering colleges in several states to hire "quality teachers" amid concerns that hundreds of them are struggling to fill their total capacity and most students passing out of those are unemployable.

About 85 colleges in Bihar, Chhatisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh have been shortlisted for the assistance in recruitment of teachers.

The HRD ministry will provide assistance in the form of technical and human resources to hire about 700 entry-level teachers in these institutions.
