VTU announces 8th sem results

BELAGAVI, DHNS: Visvesvaraya Technological University (VTU) has announced the results of eighth semester Civil and Mechanical Engineering branches.

Candidates who have successfully completed course in Civil and Mechanical Engineering branches and applying for the posts are expected to compulsorily upload their Provisional Degree Certificate along with Aadhaar Card and SSLC/ 10th Standard marks card. Hence, the interested students may apply for Provisional Degree Certificates at VTU headquarters in Belagavi.

Candidates who have passed eighth semester Civil and Mechanical Engineering examination and are interested in applying for posts in the Department of Water Resources, Government of Karnataka through Karnataka Public Service Commission can apply for provisional degree certificates at VTU, headquarters, Belagavi, for immediate requirement.

Engineering aspirants want second round of counselling

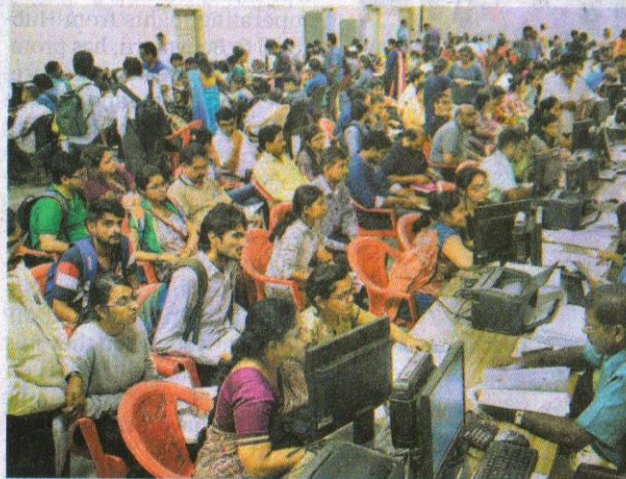

With the final allotment of medical and dental seats yet to take place, students who have participated in the counselling process for engineering seats under Consortium of Medical, Engineering and Dental Colleges of Karnataka (COMEDK) are demanding that the consortium conduct a second extended round of counselling.

Anand Byrareddy, former judge, High Court of Karnataka, who heads the admission overseeing committee, too recommended this in the interest of students.

A candidate who has got an engineering seat through COMEDK said: "After students who obtain medical and dental seats surrender the engineering seats they have picked, more seats from top colleges will be added to the pool. So I'm hoping that COMEDK authorities conduct another round."

Another candidate who appeared for COMEDK

counselling said that he hoped to surrender the seats through COMEDK if he obtains a medical seat through the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test. "It is only fair that I do not lose my money because the different counselling agencies are not coordinating with each other," he said.

As many as 4,895 candidates have already paid fees and joined colleges through the COMEDK counselling.

Over 15,000 seats were up for grabs in 140 private engineering colleges.

What is a matter of concern, however, is that the last date to complete admissions as per the Supreme Court order is July 31.

S. Kumar, executive secretary of COMEDK, said they would hold a meeting with the chairman of the admission overseeing committee and take a final decision on Thursday.
