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Learning apps click with students; VTU advises caution

Bengaluru: More than 24 mobile phone apps are available for Visvesvaraya Technological University (VTU) students to prepare for exams. But the notes available on these unauthorized apps are of substandard quality and not updated, university officials have warned.

"We have neither launched nor authorized any app for our students. We have received three proposals from app-makers, but are yet to take a decision. Students might regret later if they blindly follow the notes available on such apps," said VTU registrar Jagannath Reddy.

KR Venugopal, principal of UVCE, said: "Students must check the authenticity of mobile apps before banking on them. Taking the shortcut to preparing for exams may become troublesome later. The best way is to study from textbooks and workbooks prescribed in the syllabus."

VTU Syllabus, Smart VTU kit, V.T.U. Notes-All Sem notes, VTU CSE Study Material, V.T.U. Solution and VTU Resources-All in One are some of the apps that are a click away from students. Some Androidbased 'noteapps' have been downloaded as many as 10,000 times, indicating their popularity. Comments on Google Play, from where such apps are usually downloaded, describe them as prank app, useless app, waste of space, notes not available and notes not updated, among other things.

However, students feel these apps are useful. "They provide us with information; help us in revision ahead of examinations," said Anish S, an engineering student. He

has downloaded three such applications on his cellphone. Cambridge shows the way The Cambridge Institute of Technology, Bengaluru, has come forward to help students get updated notes.

Students of Cambridge In stitute of Technology, KR Puram have developed an Android application and website called DigiNotes through which one can get free study material that are in conformity with VTU's new CBCS scheme. "The material available on DigiNotes are prepared mostly by teachers of the Cambridge Institute of Technology and updated regularly. They will help students of other colleges as well," said Dr Shashi Ku-mar, HoD, Computer Science Engineering.

The team includes Aash Parashar, Abdul Kayes, Adwithi B, Ashwini S Kumar, Binoy Raj, B Krishna Pradeep, Deepesh Kumar Raja, Dhileep M and Himanshu Kumar Gupta, all 5th semester students of CSE department.

The notes can be accessed by visiting diginotes.in; Android users can download the DigiNotes app. The website records about 40,000 visitors per month, and the app, which was created in May 2017, has had over 5,000 downloads till date. 'Engineers prefer fat paychecks at MNCs than turning entrepreneurs'

INDIAN science and technology (S&T) students studying at elite engineering institutions such as the Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) and National Institutes of Technology (NITs) prefer fat paychecks at multinationals than turning entrepreneurs and owning their own companies.

A study by the Department of Science and Technology has found that only 12 per cent of students have high intention towards starting their own business. This is in sharp contrast to the trend abroad.

In the US, about 46 per cent of technical graduates turn entrepreneurs, while 43 per cent of Norwegian and 38 per cent of Singapore graduates start their own companies.

The study, Proactive Entrepreneurial Characteristics of Science and Technology Students: An Empirical Study in Indian Context authored by Rajib Roy and Niladri Das of the Indian

School of Mines, Dhanbad, was published in the journal Current Science dated November 10.

The authors were tasked to study the pattern among technical graduates in India by the Department of Science and Technology. The study found "low interest to pursue an entrepreneurial career" among Indian science graduates.

Noting that "entrepreneurial interest among students studying at IITs and NITs ranks way below their western counterparts", it advocated the need for "entrepreneurship courses especially designed to target S&T students."

"The course contents need to attempt in accelerating the risk-taking propensity among students. Entrepreneurship is all about taking calculated risks. Hence, students can be trained with the upside prospects of venturing, by using native businessmen as role models and also through in-depth review of their success stories," the study recommended.
