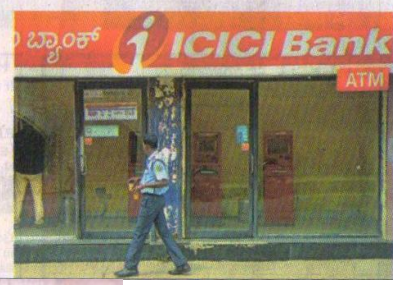

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44 engg colleges in K'taka listed under C and D categories

OF the total 200 engineering colleges affiliated to Visvesvaraya Technological University (VTU), Belagavi, 44 colleges have been listed under the C and D category. Colleges that lack infrastructure and do not have qualified teaching faculty members are listed under C and D categories. The categorisation has been done following the recent submission of Local Inquiry Committee (LIC) reports, which have been placed before the Academic senate of the university. Of the 44 colleges, 8 are government colleges and the rest are private (both aided and unaided). A communication has been sent to principals of the respective colleges

informing about it.

Speaking to The New Indian Express, Prof Jagannath Reddy, registrar of the university said, "These colleges have been warned to fall in line with the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and VTU norms as far as infrastructure and faculty is concerned. If they fail to improve by the next LIC visit, university will be forced to initiate further action against these colleges."

As per the observation made by LIC committees during their visit, these 44 colleges do not have proper infrastructure, lack laboratory facilities and even the teachers are not well-qualified and have not been recruited as per the AICTE norms.

PM's research fellowship open for all university students

NEW DELHI: Meritorious science and technology graduates from any university in the country will now be able to apply for a Centre-sponsored special fellowship to pursue M Tech or PhD.

The human resource development (HRD) ministry has decided to expand the scope of the Prime Minister's Research Fellowship (PMRF) scheme to allow meritorious students from all higher education institutions avail its benefit.

"The decision was taken in view of the growing demand from the students and suggestions from various stakeholders," the ministry sources said.

The ministry will soon issue a notification in this regard.

Centrally-fund colleges

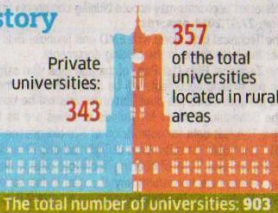
The Centre launched the scheme in February this year to attract more engineering graduates from the centrally-funded institutions to pursue M Tech or PhD programmes to boost research.

The scheme also aims at producing qualified teachers to meet the shortage of faculty members being faced by the higher educational institutions in the country.

Under the PMRF scheme, a student gets the fellowship of Rs 70,000 per month for the first two years, Rs 75,000 per month for the third year and Rs 80,000 per month in the fourth and fifth year of their programme.

Apart from this, a research grant of Rs 2.00 lakh per year is also provided to each of the fellows selected under the scheme for a period of five years to cover their academic contingency expenses and "for foreign/national travel expenses".

The special scholarship scheme provides for "rigorous review" of the performance of fellows. The continuation of the next year's fellowship depends on the outcome of the review of the students' performance.

A maximum of 3,000 fellows would be selected for a three-year period, beginning 2018-19.

Enrolment ratio slow in higher education

NEW DELHI, DHNS: The gross enrolment ratio (GER) of students in higher education continues to grow at a slow pace even though the country witnessed an increase in the number of universities from 723 in 2013-14 to 903 in 2017-18.

According to a latest All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) report released on Friday, the total enrolment in country's universities and colleges has been estimated to be 3.66 crore in 2017-18 with 1.92 crore men and 1.74 crore women.

The report pegged the GER in higher education in India

at 25.8%. The GER of men in higher education came at 26.3% while it reached 25.4% for the women.

The increase in the GER for 2017-18 over that of 2016-17 remained at just 0.6%.

The annual survey, conducted under the aegis of the Human Resource Development (HRD) Ministry, had recorded the GER at 25.2% in 2016-17. The GER of men in 2016-17 was pegged at 26% while it was estimated to be 24.5% for the women students.

The GER in higher education is calculated for 18-23 years of age group.

Left against replacing UGC with HECI

NEW DELHI, DHNS: The CPM On Thursday claimed that the NDA government's push for creating a new higher education architecture in place of the UGC was aimed at "appeasing" corporate interests, influencing the way Indian youth think and enforcing the "fascistic" ideology of the RSS.

Releasing a letter written to Prime Minister Narendra Modi against the draft Higher Education Commission of India Bill, CPI general secretary Sitaram Yechury said his party would strive to build a broad-based movement against it and listed "secular" parties like the

BSP, SP, RJD, NCP, JD(S) and the DMK among others as supporting their stand. The CPM will also rope in teachers, intellectuals and students in this fight.

Objecting to the draft bill, he said, "the bill is guided by twin concerns that threaten to destroy the foundations of Higher Education in independent India and impede the salutary role it has played, over decades, in empowering the common people with learning, jobs and social confidence. The twin concerns are privatisation and social exclusion."

The report, however, remained silent on the fall in the number of colleges and stand alone institutions in the country.

In 2017-18, the number of PhD holders slightly grew up compared to that of the previous academic year with increase in the number of colleges offering PhD programmes. As many as 34,400 students were awarded PhD during 2017. In 2016-17, a total of 28,779 students were awarded PhD.

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New curriculum, evaluation system for universities from 2019, says UGC

NEW DELHI: Universities and other higher education institutions in the country will have a revamped curriculum and evaluation system from the next academic session starting 2019.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has decided to revise the curriculum in various disciplines, clearly specifying the subject-wise learning outcomes to be measured, not just in terms of a student's knowledge, but also his/her understanding of concepts, employability, life-long learning skills, soft skills, attitudes and values.

The higher education regulator will also introduce a sys-



tem of "continuous evaluation" of students' performance from next academic session to ensure that progress is measured periodically so that remedial measures can be taken.

A committee of subject experts under the UGC will prepare the learning outcome-based 'model curricu-

lum' for 37 subjects by the end of October.

"The revised curriculum will be implemented by all universities from the next academic session," UGC chairman DP Singh said. He was making a presentation at a national conference of vice-chancellors and other higher education

institutions here on the UGC's move to revise the existing curriculum and bring reforms in examination system within a stipulated time.

Continuous evaluation of students' learning outcomes with a combination of "formative, interim and summative assessment" will come as an opportunity to learners to improve their performance.

The UGC will come with a final report on the proposed examination reforms by October 2018. It will subsequently hold workshops for faculty members at regional level in December so that higher education institutions are ready for the revised curriculum and evaluation system.
