VTU students want one-time exit scheme

Bengaluru: Students of Visvesvaraya Techological University (VTU) stomped the streets on Wednesday, demanding one-time exit scheme for CBCS (credit-based choice system) 2015 as it will result in a year being wasted for those who failed. The students demanded the varsity to either give them the option of supplementary exam or one-time exit scheme.

Students across the state gathered at Maurya Circle, shouting slogans against VTU vice-chancellor Karisid-dappa and registrar HN Jagannath Reddy. They also demanded the VTU officials to make the process of shifting from one scheme to other scheme easier for students.

The students also blamed VTU of not paying attention to their complaints and representations.



'VTU should allow us to carry over more than four papers'

Though Visvesvaraya Technological University (VTU) had tweaked its carry-over system for the choice-based credit system (CBCS) last month, students, who staged a protest on Wednesday, demanded that the rule be further relaxed.

Presently, students cannot have more than four backlogs (both theory and practicals) to enter the third year. Now, they are demanding that they should be allowed to enter the third year despite having more than four papers.

"It is up to us to decide how we clear all the papers. The university should allow us to carry over more than four papers," said a final year engineering student from a city-based college.

The university has refused. H.N. Jagannatha Reddy, Registrar (Evaluation) of the VTU, said the university could not allow any more leniency.
